### The Vision

Ladakh, with its breathtaking landscapes and vibrant culture, is renowned for its exquisite pashmina wool and the art of pashmina weaving. In recent years, there has been a growing recognition of the importance of training local women in pashmina spinning & weaving.

Despite Ladakh being home to Cashmere goats, the pashmina herders have not directly reaped the benefits of this valuable resource. Acknowledging the women's inherent knowledge of traditional spinning and weaving methods since childhood, the primary objective is to elevate these skills to a new level of expertise.





Establishing a center in Ladakh for women from different villages, focusing on training them in pashmina weaving and crafting high-quality handicrafts, embodies a transformative vision aimed at empowering local communities and preserving cultural heritage.

Beyond the acquisition of technical skills, the center serves as a hub for collective knowledge, bringing together women from different parts of Ladakh to exchange thoughts and ideas. One of the core components of the vision is to create opportunities for the trained women.

Through the empowerment of women and the promotion of their artistic endeavours, the vision seeks to weave a narrative of resilience, cultural pride, and economic prosperity for the enchanting land of Ladakh.


#### Ideation of products and procurement of material

My interest in spinning and knitting has been there since my childhood, but we used to do it on the traditional spindle and knitting pin. In 2017, there was a training organized by the Pangong Craft Centre at Phobrang for the ladies in the nearby villages, and I was one of the participants. Before the training, I used to spin and knit only for my family members and never considered earning from it. However, after the training, which included using a spinning wheel and introducing weaving, I started enjoying it more. This inspired me to do something for myself, and I decided become self-independent and pursue to entrepreneurship.

My passion for my work drives me to make time for both my craft and daily household chores, all while being there for my family. For instance, if there's a deadline for finishing certain products, I wake up early or find time throughout the day to meet it.
